

with the laws of the United States, and provide for the punishment of all such offences not provided for by the laws of the United States, and that the committee be instructed to report within five days after the beginning of the next session.

Mr. Reese offered the following:

Ordered, That any member of this House, present at the seat of government at the time of the passage of this order, who shall fail to attend its daily sessions, without being excused in accordance with the ninth article of the rules of this Body, shall be fined fifty dollars, which sum shall be paid for the use of the State;
