On motion of Mr. White,

The vote by which the bill entitled, An act to add to article 30 of the Code of Public General Laws the following sections, to be inserted next after section 202 thereof, in relation to treasonable practices and their penalties, was recommitted, was reconsidered;

The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Purnell proposed the following amendment:

After the word "purpose," in 1st section, 22d line, insert, "or if any person or persons residing within this State, who shall surrender or betray, or be in any way concerned in surrendering or betraying, any military post, fortification, arsenal or military store of this State, or the United States, into the possession or power of any enemies of either, or who shall unlawfully and without authority, usurp possession and control of any such military post, fortification, arsenal or military stores;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. White proposed the following:

In the 25th line of the 1st section, strike out "exceeding" and insert "not less than two nor more than;"

And in the 26th line, strike out "exceeding" and insert "less than five hundred nor more than;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Donaldson proposed the following:

In the nineteenth line of 1st section, strike out the word "persuade," and insert "dissuade;"

In the twenty-fifth line strike out the word "and," and insert "or;"
