

The title, as amended, was then adopted.

Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Magruder,

Ordered, That when this House adjourns it stand adjourned until Monday next, the 23d instant, at 10½ o'clock, A. M.

On motion of Mr. Harris, of Frederick,

Ordered, That the following be substituted in place of an order offered by the gentleman from Baltimore city, (Mr. Reese,) relative to the \$50 penalty applicable to members of this House, who might absent themselves after the passage of said order: "And further ordered, that the patriotism of this Assembly, is superior to any such pecuniary consideration; and, that as every member of the House of Delegates believes that his presence is absolutely necessary for the transaction of important business, our duty, therefore, as a patriotic Legislature, is plain, and as the representatives of a loyal and patriotic people, are willing to sacrifice unreservedly our personal considerations, for the benefit and welfare of our country, and have determined to remain at our posts until the said necessary business be transacted, and our Assembly regularly adjourned;"

Which was rejected.

On motion of Mr. Reese,

Mr. Findlay was excused from further attendance during this session.

On motion of Mr. McIntire,

Mr. Smyth was excused from further attendance during this session.

On motion of Mr. Leckie,

The House adjourned.
