

Mr. Donaldson, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill, entitled, An act to amend article 35 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Elections, by adding thereto, after the 45th section, the following section, prohibiting the sale or distribution of intoxicating liquors at or near the polls on days when elections are held;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Elections.

Mr. Magruder, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to repeal section 5 of article 18 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Clerks of Courts, relating to the issuing of executions from one county to another, and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Ensor, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to continue the charter of the Pipe Creek Benevolent Society;
