Severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Ordered, That the committee on engrossed bills, be and they are hereby authorised to examine into the qualifications and competency of the Committee Clerks now employed by this House, and also report the number required to perform the duties pertaining to their office, and report at the earliest day practicable.
