Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Johnson, of Baltimore county, presented the memorial of Felix Van Reuth, praying relief for injuries to property and losses occasioned him by the mob of April, 1861;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Price presented the memorial of the Orphans' Court of Baltimore city;

Which was read and referred to the Baltimore city delegation.

Mr. Dunbar presented the memorial of Nicholas Brewer and others, asking the passage of a law regulating the running at large of stock in and around the city of Annapolis;

Which was read and referred to the Anne Arundel county delegation.

The Speaker presented a communication from the Grand Scribe of the Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.
