On motion of Mr. Creswell,

The rules were suspended, and

Leave was granted a special committee, composed of Messrs. Creswell, Dougherty and Purnell, to introduce a bill to amend the 33d section, of the 37th article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to attachments by justices of the peace against witnesses failing to attend, or refusing to answer questions at the execution of commissions to take evidence from other States.

The rules were suspended to allow him to present the petition John F. Elliott and others, praying an alteration in one of the lines dividing election districts No. 1 and 12 in Dorchester county;

Which was read and referred to the Dorchester county delegation.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson,

The rules were suspended to allow him to report a bill entitled, An act to amend the 7, 8, 11 and 15th sections, of article 50, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the summoning, drawing and challenge of Jurors;
