#### REPORT :

The committee, to which was referred the Message of the Governor, dated January 4th, 1862, in regard to the disbursement of an appropriation of seventy thousand dollars, for the purchase of arms and accoutrements for the use of the State—and also in regard to the report on that subject made by the Committee on Militia of the late Legislature, to that body assembled in the City of Frederick in 1861, would respectfully report as follows:

At the January Session of the Legislature of 1860, an act was passed appropriating seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000,) for the purchase of arms and accoutrements for the use of the State—designating the Governor and the Adjutant-General of the State, as the purchasers. The Governor and Adjutant-General, therefore, in the discharge of their duty under the act, advertised for proposals to furnish the requisite number of guns, swords, pistols, accoutrements, &c., &c., and ap-
