

The bill entitled, An act to amend section 13 of article 89 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Wild Fowl, relating to the catching and killing of partridges;

Pending its second reading,

On motion of Mr. McIntire,

Was amended by striking out, in 9th line, 1st section, "the 1st day of November," and inserting "the 20th of October;" and,

On motion of Mr. Magruder,

The following section was added:

"Sec. 2. That section 15 of said article be amended and re-enacted, so as to read as follows: Any person violating either of the preceding sections shall pay a fine of five dollars, to be recovered before a justice of the peace of the county where the offence was committed; provided, that no fine shall be imposed for killing, shooting, trapping or catching any partridge, woodcock or pheasant in Charles, Talbot or Worcester county."

Mr. Phelps proposed the following, as an additional section:

"And be it enacted, That this act shall not be so construed as to prevent owners of land from shooting birds at any time upon their own premises."

Which was rejected.

The bill, as amended, was then, by special order, read a third time, and the yeas and nays, being taken on the passage of the bill, resulted as follow:
