The Secretary of the Senate returned the following :

The bill entitled, An act to repeal an act to authorize the opening of a public road in Howard and Montgomery counties, passed March 2, 1860;

The bill entitled, An act to ratify an amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America, proposed by Congress to the Legislature of the several States;

Severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, An act to refund to Samuel T. Hopkins and John Donovan certain moneys over paid by them into the State Treasury;
