The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. Findlay, from the committee on Militia, announced that the committee would be ready to make a report to-morrow, respecting the condition and wants of the State volunteers.

The Honorable, the Speaker, presented a communication from Sprigg Harwood, Esq., State Treasurer, respecting the Sinking Fund of the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The bill entitled, An act to amend the 60, 61, 62, 69, 73, 74, 75, 76 and 89th sections, relating to licenses for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer, of article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws,

Was taken up for consideration, and

Pending its second reading,

On motion of Mr. Warner,

Was amended as follows:

“Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That section 86 of said article 56, relating to licenses to oyster and eating-houses in which spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer may be sold, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof: Sec. 86. And upon such application, the said applicant shall pay to the clerk of the circuit court of the county where he resides, the sum of fifty dollars; if he resides in the city of Baltimore, shall pay according to the rent or annual value of the premises used or occupied by him for the purpose aforesaid, as follows; fifty dollars if the said rent or annual value does not exceed sixty dollars; one hundred dollars when the said rent or annual value does not exceed two hundred dollars, or one hundred and fifty dollars if the said rent or annual value shall exceed two hundred dollars; and the said applicant from the city of Baltimore shall state to the clerk, on oath, to be by him administered, the rate of rent or annual value of the house or place at or in which the business to be authorized by the license may be done or intended to be done.”
