Mr. Donaldson, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to amend the 93d article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Testamentary Law, by adding a section thereto, relating to devises and bequests and the construction of words importing the failure of issue;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Creswell, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to repeal the 33d section of the 37th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to attachments issued by justices of the peace against witnesses failing to attend, or refusing to answer questions, at the execution of commissions to take evidence from other States, and to substitute the following in lieu thereof;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.
