

Messrs. Johnson, of Baltimore county, and Dent, were deputed to convey it to the Honorable, the Senate.

After a few minutes the committee returned and reported as follows:

The committee appointed on the part of the House of Delegates, (Messrs. Johnson and Dent,) conjointly with Messrs. Goldsborough and Jenkins on the part of the Senate to count the ballots for Treasurer of the State report, that there were 79 ballots cast, of which Robert Fowler received 69 votes and Sprigg Harwood received 10 votes.

Whereupon the Honorable, the Speaker, announced "Robert Fowler, Esq., having received a majority of the votes cast is duly elected Treasurer of the State of Maryland."

The House then resumed the consideration of the bill which was pending when the House went into the election for State Treasurer.

And the bill, as amended, was by special order read a third time and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
