Mr. Magruder, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, Anact to amend sections 40, 54 and 55, of article 18, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Clerks of Courts," relating to the making and transmitting of extracts of deeds by the clerks of the several courts, to the clerk of the Court of Appeals;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Pending the second reading of the bill entitled, An act to amend the 7, 8, 11 and 15th sections of article 50th of the Code of Public General Laws, relating the summoning, drawing and challenge of Jurors;
