Leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. McIntire, Duvall and Purnell, to introduce a bill to amend an act passed January 1862, authorsing the adjustment of the accounts of J. G. O'Hara and others, Clerks in the Tobacco Warehouses.

On motion of Mr. Ensor,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation to report a bill to repeal sections 55, 56 and 57, of the Code of Public Local Laws relating to the collection of taxes in Baltimore county and to enact the same with amendments thereto.

On motion of Mr. Ensor,

Leave was granted the same select committee, to report a bill for the relief of Nicholas Stiltz, of Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Magruder,

Leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. Magruder, Donaldson and Dunlop, to report a bill to amend sections 9 and 10, of article 18, of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Clerks of Courts, relating to the emoluments of the clerks of the several courts, and requiring said clerks to account for and pay into the Treasury the excess of their emoluments over the amount limited by the Constitution.

On motion of Mr. Mathews,

Leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. Mathews, Alexander and Donaldson, to report a bill to amend the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws by repealing the 160 and 171st sections, and by adding thereto the following sections in relation to the Superior Court of Baltimore city, and the Court of Common Pleas.

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill to incorporate the Home Missionary Society of the Maryland Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church.

Mr. Duvall, from the committee on Inspections, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to amend article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore city, by repealing sections 552, 553, 554, 556, 565 and 566 in relation to the inspection and cording of fire wood, and substituting in lieu thereof the following sections in relation to the same subject;
