Mr. Magruder, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to amend section 37, of article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Negroes, relating to the escape of slaves by being transported on rail roads, steamboats and other vessels;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Herbert, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to change the name of William Perry Brinning to that of William Perry Boward;

Which was read the first, and by special order a second and third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
