Leave was granted the Dorchester and Somerset county delegations to introduce a bill to regulate the catching of oysters and fish in the waters of this State.

On motion of Mr. Matthews,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to bring in a bill to repeal the act to amend the fourth article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by repealing the 161, 162, 163, 164, 165, 166, 167, 168, 169, 170, 172 and 173d sections thereof, relating to the Superior Court and the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore city, passed at April session 1861, chapter 4, and to re-enact said sections with amendments thereto.

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, hereafter to be appointed, to introduce a bill to repeal An act, entitled, "An act to add to the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, the following section, empowering the Mayor and
