Court of Appeals to hear, at the December term of the year 1861, certain appeals in cases of petitions for writs of mandamus for and in relation to the widening and opening of Holliday street, in Baltimore city, was rejected, was reconsidered.

Mr. Given called up the report of the committee on Engrossed Bills, and,

On motion of Mr. Davis, of Montgomery,

It was amended as follows:

Strike out all after the word "orthography" to the word "whilst," in the report;

The report, as amended, was then adopted.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 387, 388, 389, 396 and 397 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, and substitute and add the following,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading;

Mr. Smyth proposed the following amendment:

In the 3rd line of the 2nd section, after the word "affidavit," add the words "before some justice of the peace;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Chamberlain proposed the following:

Sec 8, line 4, insert "two" after "thirty;"

Which was rejected.

Mr. McIntire proposed the following amendment:

In line 2, section 8, after word "corn," insert "and buck-wheat and barley;"

Which was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Given, The House adjourned.
