

City Council of Baltimore to raise and appropriate money for the defense of said city," passed at April session, 1861, chapter one.

On motion of Mr. Matthews,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to be hereafter appointed, to bring in a bill to repeal the act to confirm and ratify an ordinance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, entitled, "An ordinance to appropriate five hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the defense of the city against any dangers that may arise out of the present crisis," approved on the 20th of April, 1861, passed at April session 1861, chapter two.

On motion of Mr. Matthews,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to be hereafter appointed, to bring in a bill to repeal an act entitled, "An act to amend the fourth article of the Code of Public Local Laws by adding thereto the following sections authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to increase the public debt of said city, and repealing section eight hundred and seventy-one of said article," passed at June session, 1861.

On motion of Mr. Alexander,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary, to be hereafter appointed, to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to authorize the sale, mortgage or leasing of certain real estate devised by the last will of Solomon Betts, deceased.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

Leave was granted the Worcester county delegation to introduce a bill to amend An act to add sections to the Local Laws of Worcester county under the head of oysters, and to repeal the second section of said act passed at a special session of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1861, chapter fifty-seven.

Edward Wolfe, Caleb Parker, and Joseph Whittington, appeared and were qualified by the Speaker as Pages of the House.

On motion of Mr. White,

Leave was granted the Allegany county delegation to introduce a bill authorizing the judges of 10th election district of Allegany county to change the place of voting.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of Baltimore county,

Ordered, That the Governor is respectfully requested to transmit to the House the returns of the election of its members.
