Strike out all after the word "that," in 2nd line, section 1st, to the second "to," in the 3d line, and insert, "no vender, seller or barterer of spirituous or intoxicating drinks, whether licensed or not, shall sell, give or administer, upon any pretext whatever, within this State, except as hereinafter excepted in the 2d section of this act;"
