So the amendment was adopted.

Mr. Creswell proposed:

“Sub-section 12. Nothing in any of the sub-sections of this section contained, shall be so construed as to punish as an offence against this State, any act or thing, done in performance of any duty, or in fulfillment of any obligation imposed upon citizens of the United States by the Constitution or laws thereof;”

Which was rejected.

Mr. Phelps proposed :

“Sub-section 12. And be it enacted, This act shall take effect from and after its passage;”
