The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following Senate bills,

Severally endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 13th article of the Code of Public General Laws so far as the same relates to forging bank notes, and passing forged bank notes, by repealing the 29th and 30th sections of said article, and enacting in lieu thereof the sections herein following;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the law relating to indictments, by adding to the 30th article, of the Code of Public General Laws the following section, relating to indictments for forging or uttering forged instruments, and for false pretences and to the disposition of instruments in any indictment so as to promote the ends of justice that cases may be tried on their merits;

Which were read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.
