WEDNESDAY, December 11th, 1861.

The House met and was opened with prayer by Rev. Mr. Patterson, Chaplain of the Senate.

Mr. Hugg offered the following:

Ordered, That the Speaker be requested to have the "National Flag" hoisted on the State House, at 8 o'clock, A. M., daily, (Sundays excepted,) to remain until sunset;

Mr. Phelps moved to amend by substituting the words, "that it remain floating till both Houses adjourn," for the words "to remain until sunset."

Mr. Harris, of St. Mary's, offered the following substitute:

Ordered, That the Speaker request the Adjutant General to hoist the "National Flag" at the opening of the Houses, to remain until they both adjourn;

Which was adopted.
