The said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following:

A bill entitled, An act to repeal the 32d section of the 10th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, and to enact the following as a substitute therefor ;

Which was read, and referred to the Dorchester county delegation.

Mr. Dunbar moved that leave be granted to a special committee, to bring in a bill to repeal sections 11, 12, 13, 14 and 16, of article 55, of the Code of Public General Laws, and chapter 47, of the acts of the special session of the General Assembly, 1861, relating to the duties of the State Librarian, and to substitute therefor the following:

Mr. McIntire moved as an amendment, that the committee on the Library have leave to bring in said bill,

Which was rejected.

The original motion was then adopted, and the Speaker appointed Messrs. Dunbar, McIntire, Smith, Herbert and Bowie, Sr., said committee.
