Mr. Carroll, from a special committee, reported favorably the Senate bill, entitled, "An act to repeal the 33d section the 10th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, and to enact the following as a substitute therefor."

Which was read the first, and by special order, the second and third times and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:

The said bill was then returned to the Senate.

Mr. Herbert offered the following:

Ordered, That the committee on Claims pay to the officers of the late General Assembly who were present at its last extra session in Frederick, in the discharge of their duties, the compensation allowed by said General Assembly.

Mr. Smyth offered, as an amendment, the following:

Ordered, That the committee on Claims is hereby authorized to settle the accounts of the members of the late Legislature, and its officers, who attended at Frederick, according to the former usages of the Legislature of Maryland;

Which was rejected.

Mr. Alexander offered the following amendment:

Strike out the words, "the compensation allowed by said General Assembly," and insert "the sum of eight dollars in full for their attendance in Frederick in September last."

Which was adopted.
