

Also, a bill entitled, An act to amend the 42d article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Governor, by adding the following sections thereto to exempt the State from liability for costs incurred in the arrest of fugitives to other States and other cases of claims against the State;

Mr. Ensor, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company, in Baltimore and Harford counties;

Also, a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Union Gas Light Company of Baltimore city;

Mr. Davis, of Montgomery, from the committee on Agriculture, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 398, 399, 400, 401, 402, 403, 404, 405, 406, 407, 408 and 409, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the inspection of guano in the city of Baltimore, and add the following section in lieu thereof,

Also, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to refund to Benjamin Fawcett, late collector for the fifth collection district of Montgomery county, a sum of money erroneously paid into the treasury;

Mr. Duncan, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to make valid the election of the committee of the Presbyterian Church in Snowhill, in Worcester county, and to regulate the election of said committee in future;

Mr. Magruder, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to allow William Ireland, former collector of State and county taxes, for the third collection district of Calvert county, further time to complete his collections;

Also, a bill to allow Calvin W. Simmons, late collector of State and county taxes, for the second collection district of Calvert county, further time to complete his collections;

Which were severally read the first time.

Mr. Smith, from a select committee, reported unfavorably upon the petition of sundry citizens of Worcester and Somerset counties, for the straightening and improving a certain street and road in the town of Salisbury;

Mr. Purnell, from a select committee, reported unfavorably upon the petition of certain citizens of Worcester county, for an increase of the compensation of jurors in said county;

Mr. Duncan, from a select committee, reported unfavorably upon the petition of N. E. West, praying for a division of school districts number three and four, in Worcester county;
