

REPORT :

The tellers (Messrs. Pearson, Davis, of Charles, and Warner,) appointed on the part of the House of Delegates, conjointly with the tellers on the part of the Senate, (Messrs. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, and Jenkins,) to count the ballots for State Librarian and Bank Directors, report the following number of votes cast respectively:

For State Librarian—H. P. Jordan received sixty-eight votes, and E. M. Shipley received thirteen votes.

For Directors of the Easton Bank of Maryland—P. Groome received sixty-five votes, and William B. Massey received sixty-five votes.

For Director of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland—Rignal D. Woodward received sixty-six votes, and J. C. Parker received six votes.
