

struments of writing, relating to personal property, that appears to have been heretofore recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for the said county, and the record thereof has been destroyed, may have the same enrolled again, and the clerk of the said court is hereby required to record the same, together with the endorsement thereon of the former enrollment in the record book aforesaid, at the cost and expense of the party or parties requiring the same; and the same, when so recorded, shall have the same effect and operation in law, to all intents and purposes, as if the records aforesaid, in which the said papers were heretofore recorded, had never been destroyed;”

Which were adopted.
