Mr. Magruder offered the following as an amendment:

Ordered, That the committee on Claims, report a bill regulating the mileage of the Members of the General Assembly, according to the ordinary usage and practice of the Legislature:

Which was rejected.

The original order was then adopted.

On motion of Mr. Phelps,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the State be requested to furnish to this House, at the earliest convenient moment a statement of the several payments made up to this date to the respective Internal Improvement Companies on the Eastern Shore, organized under the act of Assembly, passed at the January session 1860, chapter 303.

On motion of Mr. Dove,

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal of this House that the absence of Mr. John Bowie, of Prince George's, from his seat, is occasioned by the illness of his son.
