On motion of Mr. Findlay,

Leave was granted the committee on Militia to introduce a bill for the relief of our volunteers, now in the field or in course of preparation for service.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to refund to Curtis W. Jacobs, of Worcester county, Maryland, administrator of William Holland, deceased, the sum of sixty-two dollars and forty-nine cents.

On motion of Mr. Pearce,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation to bring in a bill to repeal sections 139, 140 and 141 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore county, in relation to the Orphans' Court.

On motion of Mr. Donaldson,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill to amend the 107th section of the 81st article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to fixing the commissions of executors and administrators.

On motion of Mr. Dunbar,

The rules were suspended to allow him to offer the following:

Ordered, That a copy of the Journal of the House of Delegates be furnished daily to each of the Judges of the Court of Appeals.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Mathews moved that the vote by which the resolutions introduced by Mr. Findlay on Friday last were referred to the committee on Federal Relations, be reconsidered.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Findlay then called up his resolutions;

Mr. Magruder moved to recommit the resolutions;

Mr. McIntire moved the previous question,

Which being sustained,

The motion of Mr. Magruder prevailed, and the resolutions were recommitted.

Mr. Purnell, from the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the more certain and speedy apprehension of runaway slaves, and to amend the 10th section of article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws, under the head of Negroes;
