Mr. Donaldson, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to amend the 15th section, of article 50, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the challenge of jurors;

Mr. White, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to pay Aza Beall, of Allegany county, a sum of money therein mentioned;

Mr. Bond, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to add new sections to article 5, of the Code of Public Local Laws, for Calvert county, regulating the taking and catching of oysters in the waters of said county;

Mr. Hugg, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to add an additional section to the 74th article of the Code of Public General Laws;

Which were severally read the first time.
