Mr. Warner nominated Nicholas L. Wood and Samuel Hindes for Police Commissioners in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Ensor nominated Edward S. Myers for Director in the Bank of Baltimore.

The roll was then called and fifty-two Delegates responded and voted.

The Honorable, the Speaker, then appointed Messrs. Phelps, Hugg and Walton a deputation to convey the ballot-box to the Senate.

After some time, the deputation returned and submitted the following

REPORT:

The tellers, Messrs. Phelps, Walton and Hugg, on the part of the House of Delegates, conjointly with Messrs. Bayne and Briscoe, on the part of the Senate, to count the ballots for Police Commissioners of the city of Baltimore, and a Director for the Bank of Baltimore, report that there were sixty-eight ballots cast, of which Nicholas L. Wood received sixty-five votes, Samuel Hindes received sixty-two votes for Police Commissioners of the city of Baltimore, and that Edward S. Myers received sixty-three votes for Director in the Bank of Baltimore, and there was one blank vote.
