for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors, or lager beer, at or near the village of Calverton in Baltimore county;

The bill entitled, An act to regulate school taxes in Caroline county, in cases where children attend schools in districts, other than those in which they reside;

Were read the second time.

The Senate bill entitled, An act for the relief of Robert Thompson, James R. Thompson and Ford Combs;

Was read the second time,

Pending which,

The following amendment, proposed by the committee on Ways and Means, was adopted:

Add at the end of 3rd section, the following:

"And upon the further condition, that at the first term of the circuit court for St. Mary's county, after the adjustment provided for by this act, they shall confess a judgment for the principal, to be paid in instalments as herein provided."

The Senate bill entitled, An act to authorise and empower the judge of the circuit court for Carroll county, sitting as a court of equity, to pass a decree for the sale of the lands and premises of which Ferdinand Diffenback, late of Carroll county, died seized and possessed;

Was read the second time,

Pending which,

The following amendment, proposed by the committee on the Judiciary, was adopted:

Strike out the first section, after the enacting clause, and insert:

"That the circuit court for Carroll county, as a court of equity, be and the same is hereby authorised, on a bill filed or to be filed, by a creditor or creditors of Ferdinand Diffenback. late of said county, deceased, against his heirs at law or other proper parties, to pass a decree for a sale of the real estate of the deceased, for payment of his debts; provided, that the proper representatives of the said deceased, who are of full age and in the State, shall, by writing, filed in the cause, expressly waive their right to stay execution of said sale, under the provisions of the act passed at the extra session of April, 1861, chapter 17, and that the court shall be satisfied that an immediate sale of said real estate will not prejudice the interests of any of the said representatives who shall or may be under age or absent from the State; and provided, that in all other respects the court shall be of opinion that the complainant is entitled to the relief prayed."
