

The proceedings of yesterday morning were read and approved.

Mr. Hugg presented the petition from sundry citizens of Baltimore, in relation to the re-assessment of the real estate binding on North Avenue in said city;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Davis, of Charles, presented the petition from seventy-eight citizens of Charles county, asking the passage of a law for the relief of Thomas J. Boarman;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary, with instructions to report.

Mr. Davis, of Montgomery, presented the petition of W. B. Waters, William Thompson of R., Enoch B. Hutson and other citizens of Montgomery county, asking a prohibition of the sale of ardent spirits in the first election district of that county;

Which was read and referred to the Montgomery county delegation.

On motion of Mr. Herbert,

Ordered, That after to-day the House shall meet at 10, A. M., adjourn at 3, and meet at 6, P. M.,

On motion of Mr. Magruder,

Ordered, That on the day when a Senate bill is received in the House, the reading by the title shall be considered the first reading; and when such bill is reported from a committee, the reading by the title shall be considered the second reading, unless some member shall require it to be read through; and the same may be amended on the third reading if required by any member.

On motion of Mr. Price,

Leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. Price, Warner and White, to report a bill to be entitled, An act to provide for the division of the large room under the State Library in the State House, in the city of Annapolis, into three rooms of convenient size, and to have the same fitted up as committee rooms.

On motion of Mr. Hammond, of Howard,

Leave was granted the Howard county delegation to report a bill providing for the payment to the commissioners of Howard county, for academies and schools in said county, the amount heretofore appropriated to the Patapsco Female Institute.
