

On motion of Mr. Creswell,

Leave was granted the Cecil county delegation to report a bill for the relief of Sarah A. Reynolds, formerly Sarah A. Denny, of New Castle county, in the State of Delaware, by authorising the circuit court for Cecil county to direct a conveyance of certain real estate, lying and being in said county, sold to her by John B. Rowan, trustee, and by making certain docket entries of said court evidence.

Also, leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. Creswell, Hammond, of Howard, and Coale, to report a bill to amend the 30th section of the 5th article of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Appeals.

On motion of Mr. Coale,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to report a bill to amend the 1st section, of article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Licenses.

Also, to report a bill to amend article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Licenses, by adding thereto the following sections, relating to property agents and property brokers.

Leave was granted a select committee, composed of Messrs. Hugg, Stockdale and Wolf, to report a bill entitled, An act to declare vacant the seat now held and claimed by George W. Brown, Mayor of Baltimore, and to authorise the President of the First Branch of the City Council of Baltimore, for the time being, to act as and perform all the duties and functions of Mayor of said city, until the next regular election for Mayor of said city, as now provided for by the Local Laws of said city.

Mr. Coale, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to authorise Joshua Hill, the administrator upon the personal estate of Jacob Hill, a free negro, deceased, to pay the balance in his hands upon his final account, to George Hill, the son of the said Jacob Hill, a negro slave of Richard H. Murdock;

Mr. Smyth, from the committee on Colored Population, reported favorably on the bill entitled, An act to add the following section to article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Free Negroes, to authorise free negroes to hold, alienate and transfer real and personal property in this State, and to make their children capable of receiving and inheriting the same;

Mr. Kemp, from the committee on Roads and Highways, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorise and require the commissioners of each of the counties of Prince George's and
