For Governor, Augustus W. Bradford received eight hundred and ninety-four votes, and Benjamin C. Howard received seven hundred and sixty votes.

For Comptroller of the Treasury, Samuel S. Maffit received nine hundred votes, and A. Lingan Jarrett received seven hundred and fifty-nine votes.

For Judge of the Court of Appeals, William H. Tuck received six hundred and eighty votes, Robert Ford received three hundred and ninety-eight votes, and Richard I. Bowie received five hundred and nine votes.

For Judge of the Circuit Court for the first Judicial Circuit, George Brent received nine hundred and fourteen votes, and Frederick Stone received four hundred and eighty-seven votes and Robert S. Reeder received six votes.

For State Senator, Oden Bowie received seven hundred and twenty-six votes, and John H. Bayne received nine hundred and thirty-eight votes.

For the House of Delegates, George W. Duvall, of George, received nine hundred and forty-three votes, John Bowie, Sr., received nine hundred and three votes, James J. Bowie received nine hundred and two votes, Edward Herbert received seven hundred and forty votes, John M. S. Maccubbin received seven hundred and fifty-seven votes, and Fendall Marbury received seven hundred and twenty-seven votes.

For Clerk of the Circuit Court of said county, John B. Brooke received seven hundred and ninety-two votes, and Frederick Sasscer received eight hundred and eighty-two votes.

For Sheriffs, Notley D. Anderson received seven hundred and seventy-three votes, and Peter G. Grimes received eight hundred and ninety-two votes.

For County Surveyor, Samuel S. Curtis received eight hundred and ninety-four votes, and James Callahan received seven hundred and seventy votes.

For Commissioners of Tax, Richard B. Mullikin received seven hundred and ninety-three votes, Richard N. Darnall received seven hundred and sixty-three votes, Thomas H. Osbourn, of Thomas received seven hundred and sixty-five votes, Robert W. G. Baden received seven hundred and seventy-seven votes, James P. Kerby received seven hundred and fourteen votes, Edward Magruder received nine hundred and twenty-seven votes, John T. Hardisty received nine hundred and fifty-four votes, Benjamin F. Duvall received eight hundred and
