functions of the Mayor of said city, until the next regular election for Mayor of said city, as now provided for by the Local Laws of said city.

Which were severally read the first time.

The House resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, An act making appropriations for the support of the Government for the year ending on the 1st day of January, 1862;

Pending which,

Mr. Hammond, of Howard proposed to insert after the word "dollars," in the sixtieth line, the words, "Provided, that the appropriation for St. John's college, shall not take effect until the Governor shall certify to the Comptroller, that the collegiate department of St. John's college is in effectual operation."

Mr. Creswell proposed to amend, by inserting in the 59th line, section 1, after the word "schools," the words, "except the donation to St. John's college."
