Pending which,

Mr. Donaldson proposed the following amendments:

In 97th line, between the words "the" and "Secretary," insert the words "yearly salaries of the;"

In 98th line, after the word "expenses," insert the words "of the special session;"

Between lines 99 and 100, insert as follows: "for the same items for the regular session of January, 1862, sixty thousand dollars;"

In 101st line, fill the blank with "fifteen hundred dollars;"

Fill up blank in 159th line, with "five thousand dollars;"

After House of Refuge, "Maryland Penitentiary, ten thousand dollars;"

Which were adopted.

Mr. Hammond, of Howard, proposed the following amendment:

At the end of "Miscellaneous," insert, "and to the keeper of the chancery records, for extra clerk's hire and office expenses, and binding docketts, one hundred and seventy dollars and eighty-eight cents, to January 21st, 1862;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Reese proposed the following amendments:

At the end of 1st section insert:

"To the Treasurer of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, three thousand seven hundred and eighty-four dollars and seventeen cents; the sum advanced by said company, by order of the Governor, to defray the expenses of protecting and guarding certain bridges on said road;"

Add to the miscellaneous articles, "four hundred and twenty-two dollars, to pay J. G. Henning, clerk of circuit court, Montgomery county; N. H. Green, clerk, Anne Arundel; Charles S. Middleton, clerk, Prince George's; William Galloway, clerk, Harford; W. W. Watkins, clerk, Howard; R. J. Jump, clerk, Talbot; Levin Woolford, clerk, Somerset; Daniel Kent, clerk, Calvert; J. G. Reddel, sheriff, Caroline; for costs due by the State, the accounts to be adjusted by the Comptroller, on the exhibition of proper vouchers;
