Mr. Given proposed to strike out all after the enacting words of the bill and insert:

80. "The First Congressional district shall be composed of Worcester county, Somerset county, Dorchester county, Talbot county, Caroline county, Queen Anne's county and Kent county, and shall be entitled to choose one representative.

81. "The Second Congressional District shall be composed of Cecil county, Harford county, Baltimore county and Carroll county, and shall be entitled to choose one representative.

82. "The Third Congressional District shall be composed of the wards of Baltimore city, from the first to the fifteen inclusive, and shall be entitled to choose one representative.

83. "The Fourth Congressional District shall be composed of Allegany county, Washington county, Frederick county, Montgomery county and Howard county, and shall be entitled to choose one representative.

84. "The Fifth Congressional District shall be composed of St. Mary's county, Charles county, Calvert county, and Anne Arundel county, with the city of Annapolis, Prince George's county, and the sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteen, nineteenth and twentieth wards of Baltimore city, and shall be entitled to choose one representative.

"85. "The return judges of the elections of representatives
