Mr. Ensor, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act supplementary to an act passed at December session, 1847, chapter 160, entitled, An act to make a turnpike road in Washington county;

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to authorise the armorer at Frederick city to contract for altering and repairing flint lock muskets, belonging to the State of Maryland, now in the possession of the several captains in Frederick county;

The bill entitled, An act to empower the county commissioners of Worcester county, to build a new bridge or repair the present bridge across the Pocomoke river, at Snow Hill;

Was read the second time, and,

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

Laid on the table.
