

to another overt act of the same treason," in the 9th and 10th lines;

After the word "wilfully," in the 3rd line of sub-section 3, insert the words, "and for the purpose of promoting rebellion or war against this State;"

Amend sub-section 8, in the 90th line, by striking out the word "it," and inserting, after the word "feeling," in the 89th line, the following words, "or shall, during the present rebellion against the government of the United States, without the consent of the Government of the United States, offer inducements to any minor, or other person, to abandon his home or place of temporary residence for the purpose of going into any of the States in rebellion, or shall furnish to any minor, or other person, money, clothing or conveyance of any kind, for the accomplishment of any such intended object, although the same may not have been effected, each one of said offences;"

Add the following to sub-section 11, "residents of this State at the date of their enlistment;"

Amend by adding as sub-section 13: "And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the judges of the courts having criminal jurisdiction within this State, to give this act in charge to the grand juries of their respective courts, at every term of their court;"

Amend by striking out "13" and inserting "14," in the line where the word "sub-section" occurs;

Strike out all after the word "after," in the 123rd line, and insert the words, "the 15th day of April next after the passage hereof."
