An act to enlarge the powers of the mayor and city council of Baltimore, in regard to water, by incorporating certain additional sections in article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws:

An act to repeal sections 799 and 802, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, in relation to certain nuisances in the city of Baltimore, and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto;

An act to provide for the care and custody of Washington Monument in the city of Baltimore;

An act to add certain sections to article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to horses and carriages kept at livery in the city of Baltimore;

An act to amend the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto the following sections empowering the mayor and city council of Baltimore to levy an additional license tax on all persons or bodies politic engaged in selling or vending spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer, in the city of Baltimore, to aid said mayor and city council in paving the streets and supporting the Baltimore city jail;

An act to empower the mayor and city council of Baltimore, to levy and collect taxes on all property within the corporate limits of the city of Baltimore, which is not otherwise specially exempted from taxation;

An act to amend article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the city of Baltimore, by imposing penalties for polluting the water in Swann Lake, the dam, reservoir, lines of conduit, water pipes, gate house or other works constructed or used in supplying the city of Baltimore with water, or injuring, defacing or destroying the same.

An act to repeal sections 34, 35, 37, 39, 58 and 61, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

An act to authorise the Hagerstown Female Seminary, to raise money to pay off its debts and in further amendment of its charter, passed at January session, 1852, chapter 185;

An act to authorise and empower the burgess and commissioners of Uniontown in Carroll county, to change the location of a public alley in said town;

An act to incorporate the Montgomery, Howard and Carroll Railroad company;

An act for the relief of the sureties on the official bonds of Thomas C. Lyles and William Lyles, former collectors of Prince George's county;
