Constitution and Form of Government for this State, and to provide for the election of Delegates to said Convention;

An act to repeal section 5, of article 18, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Clerks of Courts, relating to the issuing of executions from one county to another, and to reenact the same with amendments thereto;

An act to authorise and empower the circuit court of Kent county, to receive and entertain a petition from Daniel Jones, of said county, to divide the real estate of the said Daniel Jones and Catharine Y. Jones, deceased, to appoint five commissioners to make such division, with full powers to make such division and return their proceedings to the said court, which shall confirm or reject the same, as to justice and equity, may appear;

An act to amend the 2d section of an act entitled, An act to repeal the 19th section, of the 29th article, of the Code of Public General Laws, and the proviso of the 33rd section, of the 5th article, of said Code, relating to the stay of execution, and to extend the time for enforcing the execution of judgments, passed May 10th, 1861;

An act authorising the Treasurer to pay, on the warrant of the Comptroller, certain sums of money erroneously paid into the Treasury, by clerks and registers of wills, since the adoption of the present State Constitution;

An act to amend the 53rd article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to landlord and tenant, by adding thereto the following sections, extending the provisions of said article to other tenancies, and giving a single justice of the peace in three several counties the same powers, in all cases in a proceeding to dispossess a tenant holding over, as are or may be exercised by two justices of the peace and a jury, under the first five sections of said article;

An act to make certain improvements in the vicinity of the live stock scales in Baltimore county;

An act to amend sections 31, of article 5, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to appeals from courts of law or equity;

An act to repeal an act passed on the 20th June, 1861, at the extra session of the General Assembly, chapter 72, entitled, An act to make valid the qualification of Tench Tilghman as Major-General of the Second Division of Maryland Militia;

An act appropriating a sum of money to pay the members of the Williamsport Guard, a military company engaged in protecting the public works;
