The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following Senate bill:

A bill entitled, An act to repeal so much of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws for the city of Baltimore, as relates to the inspcetion of tobacco, commencing with section 495 and ending with section 551, both inclusive, and to add to said article, under the head of tobacco, new sections, making other provision for the inspection of tobacco; which,

Which was read the first time, and,

On motion of Mr. Donaldson,

Was referred to a select committee, composed of Messrs. Donaldson, Bowie, Sr., Dunlop, Everhart and Dent.

Also, returned:

The bill entitled, An act to add a new section to article 9 of the Code of Public Local Laws for Charles county, to regulate the rate of constables' fees in said county;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

Also, the bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 387, 388, 389, 396 and 397, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and substitute and add the following;

Endorsed, "enacting clause stricken out."

The House resumed the consideration of the bill which was pending when the House adjourned.
