The bill entitled, An act to make valid a deed from Charles Johnson to Elizabeth and Franklin Duyer;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to empower the county commissioners of Worcester county, to open a public road in the second and seventh election districts of said county;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to allow Perry Leizear, late collector of taxes in the fifth collection district of Montgomery county, further time to complete his collections;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to authorise the Comptroller to adjust and settle the accounts of the inspectors of grain in the city of Baltimore:

Severally endorsed, “passed by yeas and nays.”

The bill entitled, An act to prevent the sale or gift of intoxicating drinks to the free negroes of this State, and to repeal so much of the 75th section of the 66th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to dealing with free negroes as prohibits the sale of ardent spirits to free negroes and punishes that offence;
