Charles county, Queen Anne's county, Calvert and St. Mary's county, each thirty dollars;"

Which was adopted.

Mr. Mathews proposed the following:

Section 3. After the word appeals in the 1st line strike out all to the end of the section and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"And the clerk of the Superior court of Baltimore city, shall pay to the Treasurer two hundred dollars each, and the clerks of the circuit courts of the several counties shall each pay the sum of one hundred dollars, when they respectively take the oath of office;"

Which was adopted.
