lows Parish and their successors in office, to receive the bequest made in the last will and testament of Chesed Purnell, and dispose of the same in the manner indicated in said last will and testament;

An act to authorise and empower the trustees of the Union Academy of Baltimore county, to sell said property and to purchase another site;

An act to authorise the Comptroller to issue his warrant to enable General Edward Shiver to pay into the Treasury a certain sum of money;

An act to repeal the 104th section, of article 63, of the Code of Public General Laws, in relation to the oath of militia officers, and re-enact the same with amendments thereto;
