

“Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That this act shall continue in force until the first day of January, 1880, and until the end of the next regular session of the General Assembly thereafter, and shall take effect from and after its passage;”

Mr. McIntire proposed the following:

“Sec. 8. And be enacted, That the Legislature hereby retains the right to alter, amend or repeal this act of incorporation at pleasure;”

Which was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
