to close the Journal of Accounts, up to Monday next inclusive, except such members and officers as may be compelled to remain in closing up the unsettled business of the session, and such persons shall not be entitled to mileage for such detention. No certificates shall be issued to any member or officer of the Senate or House, before Monday next, March 10th.

On motion of Mr. Price,

Ordered, that the Chairman of the committee on Claims issue his certificate for one hundred and fifty dollars, in favor of Rev. Mr. Davenport, for compensation for services as Chaplain to this House.
