

273 and 276, of article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to public schools in Washington county:

Was read the third time,

Pending which,

The following amendments were adopted:

Strike out all after the word "shall," in line 5, of the 3d section, and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"Direct and elect from the inhabitants thereof, three discreet persons who shall constitute a board of trustees for said school, and shall serve for one year from the date of their election, and until their successors are elected; provided, at least fifteen days previous notice in writing shall be set up in at least three of the most public places in said district, specifying the time and place of such election."

Line 2, section 1, strike out all in said line after the word "six," and strike out the word "seven," in line 3.

Section 3, line 6, strike out all after the word "quarter," and in line 7, strike out all before the word "and."

And the bill was then passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
